What is Spelling Frame?

Spelling Frame is an online resource designed to support children with learning and practising spellings. It follows the National Curriculum spelling rules for each year group and offers a wide range of interactive activities, games, and practice tests.

Using Spelling Frame, children can:

- Learn spelling rules through clear explanations and examples.
- Practise words in fun and engaging ways, tailored to their year group.
- Take practice tests that give instant feedback.
- Revisit tricky words as often as needed to build confidence.

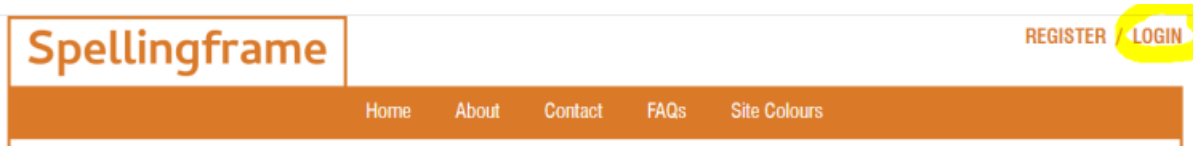
Why are we using Spelling Frame?

We are using Spelling Frame to help children strengthen and retain understanding of the spelling rules and patterns taught in class. The platform provides interactive games, quizzes and practice tests that make learning spellings engaging and enjoyable. By using Spelling Frame regularly, children can revisit key spelling patterns at their own pace, receive immediate feedback and track their progress over time. This consistent, tailored practice supports long-term retention and builds confidence in applying correct spellings across all areas of their writing.

How do I use Spelling Frame?

Please find below some step-by-step instructions for using Spelling Frame.

1. Go to the Spelling Frame website: <https://spellingframe.co.uk/>
2. Click log in and type in your child's log in details.



3. Click dashboard on the top right-hand corner. Here, your child can see their spelling points and their latest test results (for tests taken at home online), as well as 'active tests' that have been set by their teacher.

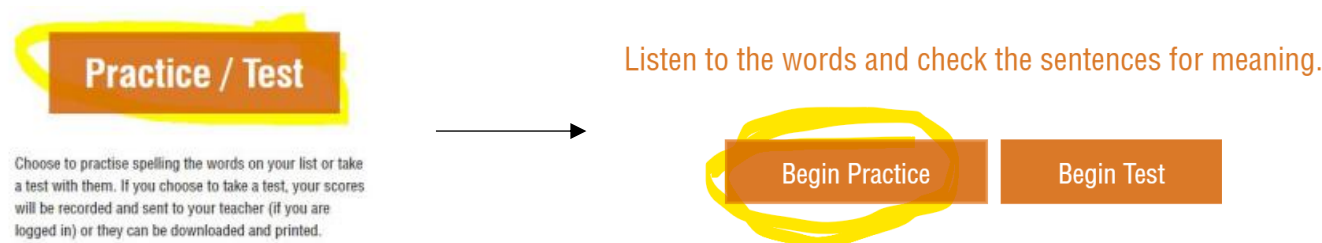

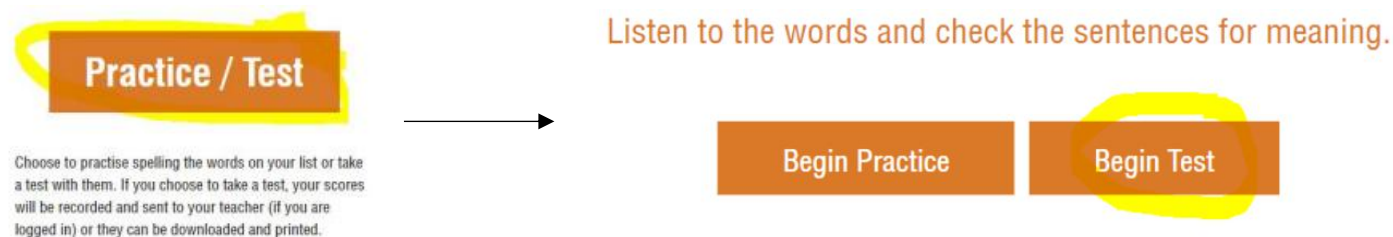
4. Click 'Go To Test'. This will take your child to their test, as well as spelling rule games. Here your child can access a range of games and resources to help them to revise their spellings before they take the test.

- Segment Puzzle – matching up the syllable sections
- Sorting Segments – looking at the syllables and sorting into correct and incorrect spellings
- Segment Silhouette – using the shapes of each letter within the syllables to aid spelling
- Wordsearch – finding the spelling word within a grid
- Type it – spelling the word

To keep it varied, please encourage your child to use a range of these activities each time they log on, as well as playing a game. As well as these games and activities, children can complete a practice test before the final test.



5. Once your child has practised the spelling words, they are ready to complete the test. Click on '**Begin Test**'. Before taking the test, it is important that your child chooses for the spellings to be read aloud. This should be done no matter how competent a reader your child is. Completing these online tests helps Spelling Frame to tailor to your child's profile and allows your child's teacher to monitor their spelling progress.



6. After doing a test, your child can return to the dashboard and practise their tricky words at any time. Every time your child spells incorrectly in the test, the word is added to their list of 'Tricky Words'. They can return to

their 'Tricky Word' list any time and revise the words that caught them out in previous spelling rules. Making use of this feature is recommended.

When will spellings be set?

Spelling tests, consisting of five or six words, will be set **every Thursday** and will be due to be completed by the **following Thursday**, giving your child a week to practise and complete the test. Your child's class teacher will share the link on Teams when setting homework so you will know when a new test is available.

How can I help my child with their spelling?

Encourage your child to use Spelling Frame regularly to practise their spellings and to complete the tests set by their class teacher. Short, frequent practice sessions work best, as research shows that revisiting learning over time helps with long-term retention. In between tests, encourage your child to visit their 'tricky words' section to continue learning words that they have found tricky. You are also welcome to use alternative methods at home to practise your child's spellings in ways that suit them (e.g. look, cover, write, check).

Will Spelling Frame replace spelling books?

Each child will begin with a personalised spelling book, featuring words identified from their spelling assessment that need further practice. This will be used alongside Spelling Frame, meaning that for a short while your child will have two sets of spellings to learn. When their book is complete, children will continue their spelling practice using Spelling Frame only.

Initial Hiccups

With any system, there are bound to be a few initial problems when children access Spelling Frame for the first time. Please ask as many questions as necessary. There is so much information initially, but you will find it simple to use within a short space of time. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions or issues accessing Spelling Frame.
