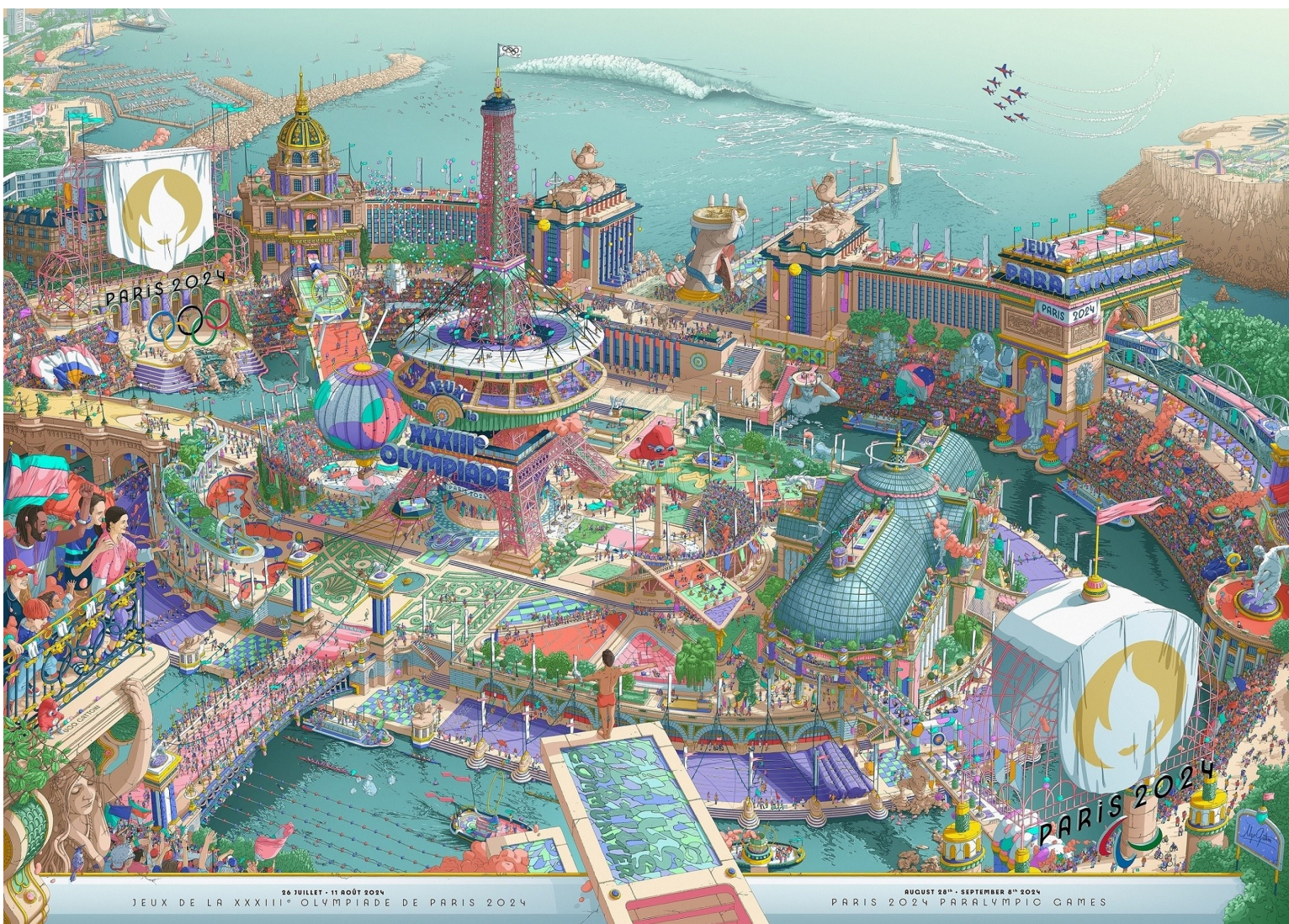

THIS IS ME!

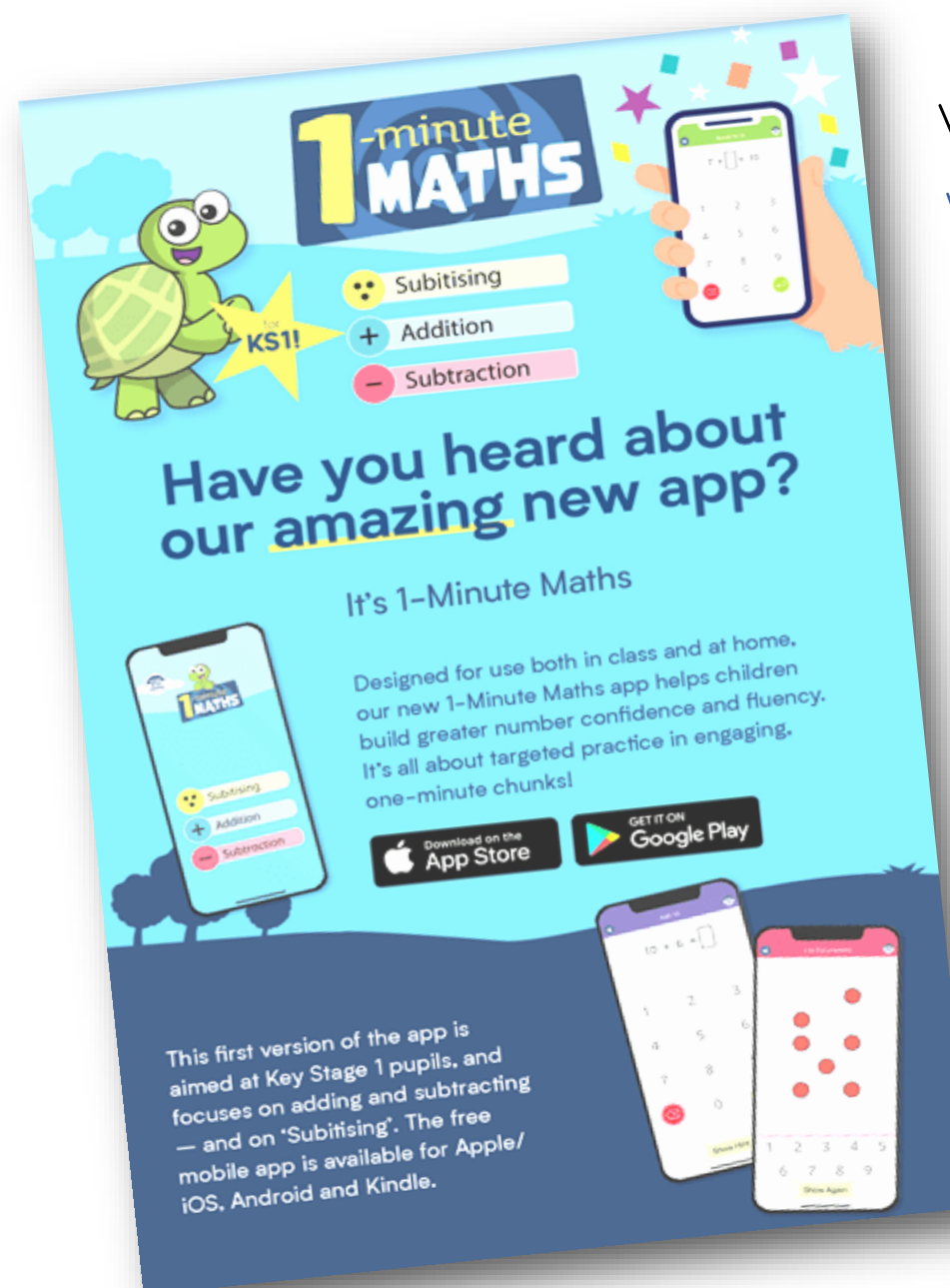
I would really like to get to know you before we start Year Three together in September.
