Focus - Phonemes ff / ll / ss / j

Phonemes we will be focusing on this week in school -



Pronunciation Phrase - ff

Open your lips a little; put your teeth on your bottom lip and push the air out to make the sound **ffff ffff**

Digraph (ff) -
two letters, one sound



Pronunciation Phrase - ll

Open your mouth a little; put your tongue up to the top of your mouth, behind your teeth, and press **llll**

Digraph (ll) -
two letters, one sound



Pronunciation Phrase - ss

Show your teeth and let the s hiss out **ssssss**

Digraph (ss) -
two letters, one sound



Pronunciation Phrase - j

Pucker your lips and show your teeth use your tongue as you say **j j j**

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Phase 2 - Autumn 2 Week 2
Focus - Phonemes v / w / x / y

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Phonemes we will be focusing on this week in school -



Pronunciation Phrase - v

Put your teeth against your bottom lip and make a buzzing sound **vvvv**



Pronunciation Phrase - w

Pucker your lips and keep them small as you say **w w w**



Pronunciation Phrase - x

Mouth open, then push the **cs/x** sound through as you close your mouth **cs cs cs (x x x)**



Pronunciation Phrase - y

Smile, tongue to the top of your mouth; say **y y y** without opening your mouth

Words with s /s/ added at the end (hats / sits)

Pucker your mouth, then
open it as you say **qu qu**

Pucker your lips and show
your teeth; use your
tongue as you say **ch ch ch**

Focus - Phonemes sh / th / ng / nk

Pronunciation Phrase - sh

Show me your teeth and push the air out
shshshshsh



Pronunciation Phrase - th

Voiced: Tongue on your teeth, teeth almost closed to make a 'buzzing' th

Unvoiced: Tongue on your teeth and push the air out th



Pronunciation Phrase - ng

Open your mouth a bit and then use your tongue at the back of your mouth to say ng ng ng



Pronunciation Phrase - nk

Open your mouth a bit and then use your tongue at the back of your mouth to say nk nk nk
